When the inmate's application is approved, the inmate is placed on a waitlist. Individual treatment needs are determined by their RAD recommendations and modified throughout treatment. Victim Empathy and Relapse Prevention are required treatment modules. Inmates usually begin SOTP two to three years prior to their tentative parole date, or the date their minimum term of imprisonment expires. The program takes an average of 24 months to finish depending on the inmate and not counting any possible disruptions such as waiting for a particular treatment module to become available or inmate misconducts. Psychosexual risk assessments are done towards the end of their program for further treatment and sex offender management and supervision recommendations. Inmates who complete the program are recommended to continue treatment in aftercare sessions if they enter the work furlough program or are released on parole. Inmates who complete the core program but during incarceration, work furlough, or parole continue to demonstrate high risk sexual behavior can be recommended to return to the core treatment program to review their deviant cycle and address other pertinent areas of high risk.
