- DPS requested \$25M in 2022
 - i. \$15M 2024
 - ii. \$10M 20245
- Legislature did not approve \$15M for FY24, but approved \$10M for FY25
- DPS requested \$7M from Governor's fund to keep project moving
 - i. Process moved from $B\&F \rightarrow Governor's$ office
- \$1.5M remaining from previous year being used currently
- Dept. of Agriculture needs to move current quarantine site first
- October 10th & 11th, 2023 Outreach event (YWCA-Nuuanu)

- Psych and social workers in facility talking to inmates
- Don't have resources to allow inmates to funerals but will do best for contact
- All supplies provided come from Wailuku except for refuse
 - i. 5 weeks of food
 - ii. Medications
- Will work with National Guard and HIEMA regarding refuse disposal
